

COVID-19 Vaccination and Treatment

Who should get vaccinated?

- All persons 5 and older are eligible for primary series and first booster
- Immunocompromised and Individuals over 50 are eligible for a second booster

Do vaccines work against the new variants?

- Vaccinations and boosters reduce hospitalizations, death, and long COVID from Omicron and BA.2.12.1
- We expect vaccines will continue to protect against subsequent Omicron variants
- Vaccination may not prevent mild illness, but it significantly protects against serious illness, hospitalization, and death

COVID-19 Treatment Options

- Treatments are approved for individuals 12 and older at high risk for severe illness from COVID-19
- Contact your primary care provider ASAP as they may be able to prescribe treatment or refer you to a place that does
- If not, you can schedule an appointment at one of the Monoclonal Antibody Regional Centers at 619-685-2500
- No referral is needed, and treatment is free regardless of insurance or immigration status
